What would members like to see CFS do?

Award training scholarships to develop new leadership within activity groups e.g. give grants to CFS members to attend caller workshops in exchange for assuming

responsibility for key roles in the dance community

Access funding for special projects through arts grants e.g. Benton Cultural Trust

Collaborate with local radio stations: e.g. community station KORC, OSU station KBVR. CFS can support station by donating and actively promoting; station can create programming opportunities for CFS:

Run "spot" ads, interviews, performances by local musicians/ bands,

Host a regular feature about folk music and arts in the community Dave noted that Steve Smith records all Best Cellar performances; This rich archive could be tapped to program locally broadcast shows

Increase the number and types of dance events/groups: * waltz eclectic, children's folk dance, swing, latin dance, contra dance on-campus, techno contra, queer-centric & alt waltz focused groups

Increase OSU community participation

Promote on-campus participation & gain access to campus resources /venues

Expand access to local spaces for performances and activities Community schools & churches, grange halls,
Private homes & retreat spaces
